Submitting an article to The New Mosquito

The **Salonika Campaign Society** was formed to promote interest in the Salonika Campaign, fought in northern Greece, Serbia and Albania from 1915 to 1918. The aim of the Society is to perpetuate the memory of those of all nations who served, whether they were members of the armed forces, medical services or civilian staff. The Society does not seek to glorify war and is neither politically nor commercially motivated.

The New Mosquito is the journal of the Salonika Campaign Society. It takes its name and the design of its logo from *The Mosquito*, 'the official organ of the Salonika Reunion Association'.

Aims of The New Mosquito Journal

The Journal aims to publish within two publications per year in April and September. April and September are in remembrance of the First Battle of Dorian 24 – 25 April 1917 and the Second Battle of Dorian 18 – 19 September 1918.

The Journal aims to

- provide a platform to share, debate and challenge new and existing narratives,
- serve as a vital archive and help build a shared cultural memory,
- support scholars and enthusiastic members in their research,
- connect the past and present and make history accessible to a diverse audience.

What you will find in the Journal

Whether you are deeply knowledgeable about the Salonika Campaign or just beginning your journey of discovery, the Journal offers a unique combination of original deeply researched articles, personal stories and rare materials including letters, diaries, and photographs from private collections. Collectively, they offer a broad range of insights about the Salonika Campaign and are written by leading researchers and enthusiastic members of the society.

Submitting an article

Articles are not peer reviewed although the editor and proof reader will amend as necessary small corrections. Therefore, the authors are requested to kindly submit an article following these guidelines. The following is not an exhaustive list of styles and settings, but a general guidance for contributors to the Journal.

Word Document - All articles should be submitted as word documents – full page with normal margins and page layout as simple as possible. Please use font 12 Arial.

The number of words: 1000 – 3500 for an original piece of research article, 500 – 1500 for a personal article. There may be some exceptions, for example, in special editions and the publication of multi-part pieces based on diaries/sets of letters.

Text - Please provide all articles as a 'text only' document. All pictures and illustrations should be provided as separate jpg files. When providing images, please provide a separate list of captions cross – referenced to the images provided. All pictures and illustrations should be copyright free with acknowledgements to their source.

All alignments should be left justified; there should be no indentation and line spacing should be single.

Title and Name of Author – the title will give the reader information on the article's content, include first and last name of author.

Dates – all dates should be in the format - Date Month Year, e.g. 22 August 1917.

Times – all times should be in the format – 11.15am or 5.30pm or 1115 hours or 1730 hours.

Italics – should be used for the following:

- Titles of publications or documents (do not use quotation marks)
- Ships names, e.g. HMS *Victory*
- Latin or foreign phrases

Quotation Marks – use single quotation marks. Only use “double quotation” marks when quoting within a quotation.

Numbers – all numbers below 100 should be in words and not figures. Except for ages (e.g. 7-year-old child) and units of measurement (e.g. 6 litres).

Ordinal Numbers – the 'th' should be normal script and not superscript, e.g.45th Regiment, 6th Division.

Capital Letters – Capital letters should only be used at the start of a sentence and for names and Battles/Actions. For example, First Battle of Doiran, Action at Tumbitza Farm.

Ranks – Consistency in the article will be expected, standard abbreviations or full title.
For example, Lt. Col. or Lieutenant Colonel
For example, 2nd Lt or 2nd Lieutenant

Units

XII Corps rather than 12th Corps

26th Division rather than 26 Division

For infantry brigades: 79th Brigade rather than 79 Brigade

For artillery brigades: 99th Brigade (RFA) rather than Roman numerals

Royal Engineers: 107th Field Company (RE)

Infantry battalions: 7th Wiltshires rather than 7/Wiltshires or 7th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment

RFC/RAF: No.47 Squadron (RFC) rather than 47 Squadron (RFC) or 47th Squadron (RFC)

Endnotes and References - Please do not use footnotes within an article. Use endnotes within the body of the article with references at the end, preferably fewer than 25.
